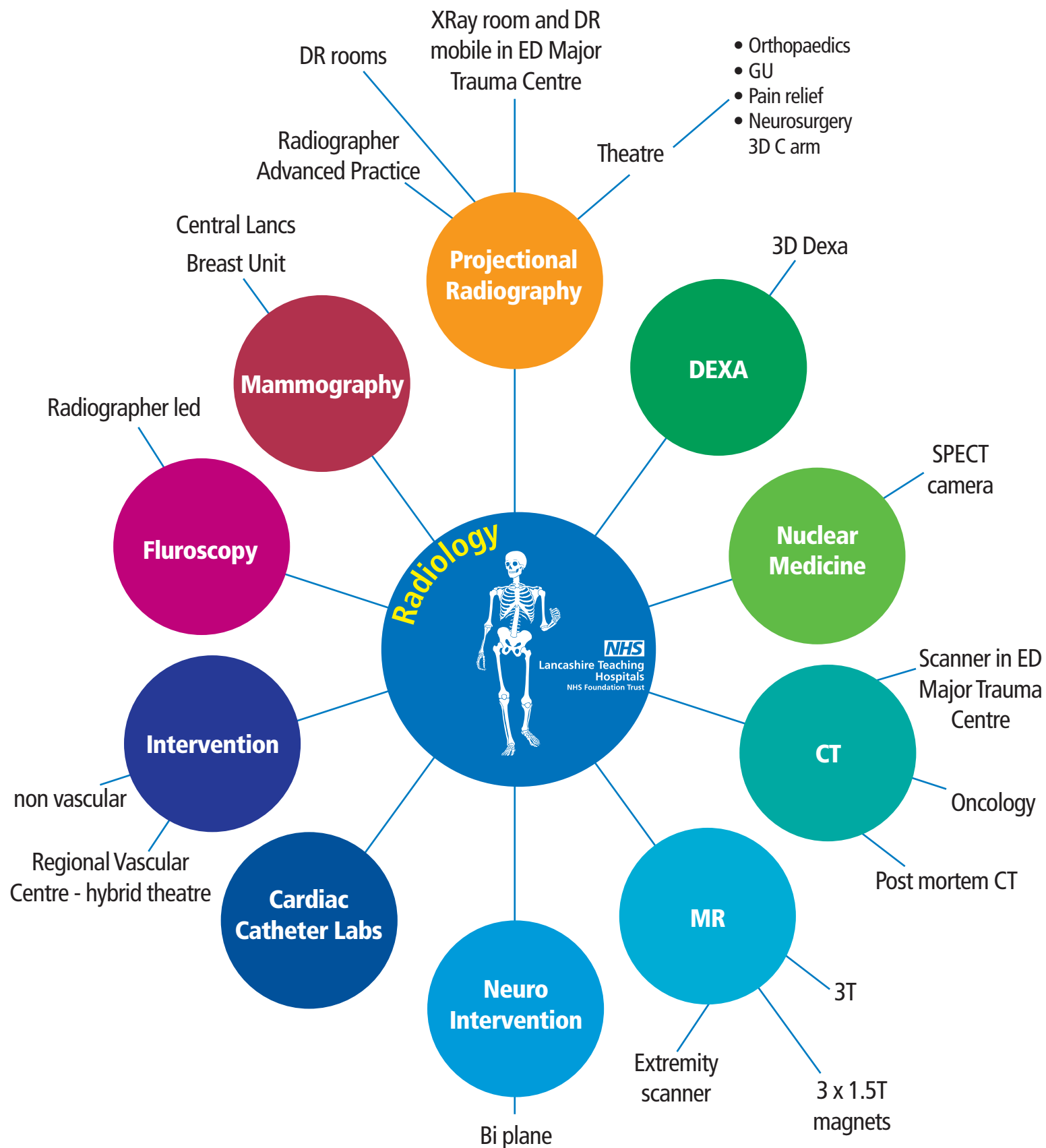

Once you have been qualified for a year you will be encouraged to become a mentor for student radiographers. We work in conjunction with the University of Cumbria to provide practical placements for 36 undergraduate student radiographers over the 3 year course.

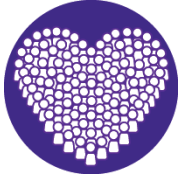
