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1.0 Role Summary

The Anaesthetic Directorate is led by a team supporting the perioperative model recommended by the Royal College of Anaesthetists. This comprises a Clinical Director and Associate Clinical Directors for Royal Preston Hospital Theatres, Chorley and South Ribble District General Hospital Theatres, Pre-Operative Care and Workforce.

We provide many tertiary services including, Neurosurgery, Interventional Radiology, Vascular, upper GI, major oncology surgery, maxilla facial, Plastics and Burns.

The Directorate also houses a 34 bedded Critical Care Unit for all of the above specialties. Our Critical Care Department has an extensive national research portfolio.

This fellow post can be used to support applicants to gain CT3 anaesthetics equivalent competencies should the successful candidate require this.

Applicants are invited to apply for this Senior Clinical Fellow in Anaesthesia and will be expected to provide pre-operative assessment, anaesthesia and follow-up. You will be offered experience in the range of subspecialties we cover, a regular commitment to medicaleducation in a variety of areas such as undergraduate medical students and simulation at Lancashire Simulation Centre and the option of a regular commitment to our state of the art clinical research facility. There will be a combination of teaching lists and solo lists with appropriate supervision.

The post holder will be expected to have experience in Anaesthesia and ideally in Intensive Care Medicine. The post holder will be expected to work under distant supervision especially during out of hour's shifts.

The Department of Anaesthesia is committed to continuing its teaching role and considerable importance is attached to the support of the junior medical staff in the Department. In addition to routine NHS teaching responsibilities the Directorate has been funded to provide a significant contribution to the training of undergraduate medical students whose numbers have increased up to 300.

It is essential that the applicants be committed to their own continuing medical education and professional development.

The Clinical Director is managerially responsible for the Consultant Anaesthetists of the Chorley and South Ribble and Royal Preston Hospitals; together with all other grades of Anaesthetists. There are separate directorates for Critical Care and Pain. These staff do also work within the Directorate of Anaesthesia.

2.0 Key Duties and Responsibilities

To promote high professional standards of clinical care for patients, both through direct patient care, supporting professional activities and by the maintenance of continuing professional development.

The post holder will:

- Provide an Anaesthetic service across the Trust.
- Participate in the trainee anaesthetic rota on both hospital sites with additional cover during colleagues' absence.
- Assume a continuous commitment for the care of patients, even if employed less than full-time and ensure, in consultation with colleagues, that adequate arrangements are made for leave and off duty periods.
- Promote high professional standards of clinical care for patients, both through direct patient care and by the maintenance of continuing professional development.
- Exercise the freedom to assist in development of specialist elements of the services to reflect perceived priorities within available resources.
- Undertake administrative duties involved with the care of his/her patients.
- Promote high professional standards of clinical care of patients and the health and safety of the theatre environment.
- Maintain continuing education and professional development at least to the requirements of the Royal College of Anaesthetists.

3.0 What We Can Offer

Modern Education Centres are based at both Royal Preston and Chorley and South Ribble Hospital sites and offer excellent library and study facilities, including PC/Internet support for staff and students.

As a teaching hospital, we encourage all our staff to participate in teaching and training at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels. We are committed to developing our teaching and academic activities and can facilitate meeting any training needs for these roles.

We support the requirements for Continuing Medical Education as laid down by the Royal Colleges and are committed to providing time and financial support for these activities.

We are able to offer CT3 equivalence for anaesthetists who require this. Specific modules and requirements can be discussed with the college tutors.

We are also able to offer a regular commitment to medical education in a variety of areas such as undergraduate medical students and simulation at Lancashire Simulation Centre. 4.0 Contractual and Remuneration arrangements

This post is subject to the Lancashire Teaching Hospitals Trust Doctor contract.

Basic Pay is in line with Nodal point 4 (MT04) which is £55,329 per annum. Enhancements would be paid in line with the contract should the post holder work over and above 40 hours per week (averaged over the rota cycle) or undertake any out of hours work/non-resident on-call.

The contract may be supplemented or amended by local collective agreements reached with trade unions recognised by the Trust and the rules and resolutions of the Trust Board.
