Job summary (overview of role/remit)

- Responsibility for carrying out Vehicle and Equipment maintenance safely, effectively and efficiently ensuring work is completed to a high standard in accordance with Legislation, Trust Policy, Vehicle Operators Service Agency standards and Manufacturers guidelines across a large and diverse fleet of vehicles and specialist equipment.
- To carry out all duties following a shift pattern (where applicable) which is to include bank holiday working (where required)

Responsible for conducting the servicing, repairs and maintenance of the Trusts Fleet and equipment in order to ensure the safety of patients, staff and to support assurance of correct diagnosis and treatment of patients.

The Fleet and equipment can include:

- Dual crewed ambulances
- Rapid response vehicles
- Support Fleet

- Patient Stretchers
- Patient carry Chairs

To organise and contribute to the planned preventative maintenance (PPM), servicing and repairs of a wide spectrum of vehicles and medical devices to ensure all equipment operates effectively and safely with minimum downtime. Responsibilities will include:

- Maintenance and repair
- Servicing
- Fault diagnosis and repair
- Electrical/Electronic fault diagnosis and repair
- Function testing
- Maintenance and repair

The post holder will be required to communicate with a variety of stakeholders that include operational users, clinical users and staff groups to gain a full understanding of the nature of fault or problem with the vehicles and equipment, conducting problem investigation of highly specialised and highly complex vehicles & equipment for the diagnosis and treatment of patients to ensure the safety of staff and patients at all times. Assess the seriousness of the issues and implications and respond appropriately to the urgency of the requests.

Main duties and responsibilities

- Responsible for contributing to the efficient running of the Planned Preventative Maintenance (PPM) scheme to ensure:
- Vehicles and equipment are regularly checked for safety to Trusts Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs)
- The vehicles and equipment function to manufacturer's specifications.
- Carry out diagnosis calibration and quality control checks.
- Carry out acceptance testing and electrical safety testing in accordance with local policies.
- To ensure that all vehicles and equipment are serviced and maintained in line with current legislation and manufacturers guidelines.
- To ensure any vehicle and equipment upgrades are carried out in a safe and proficient







manner.

- To ensure any software updates are carried out in a timely and proficient manner.
- Working in conjunction with the Medical device and Make Ready teams to ensure an adequate supply of fit for purpose vehicles and equipment are available to maintain vehicle availability.
- Deputize for the team leader in their absence
- Using technical knowledge through formal, internal/external training & experience to carry out fault diagnosis, repair, servicing and component overhaul and replacement including advice on equipment specification and evaluation. Ensure exceptional levels of accuracy when undertaking fault diagnosis to minimize vehicle and equipment downtime
- Diagnose faults to determine the nature of defects and using specialist knowledge and professional judgment; evaluate the condition of the vehicles and equipment to repair/rectify for continued operational use or disposal when appropriate.
- Undertake highly complex fault finding on a daily basis with suitable techniques to diagnose and resolve problems. Exercise judgment to determine the causes of faults in devices with multiple complex and inter-related systems; ensuring the repairs and maintenance of vehicle s and equipment and are with minimum disruption to operational needs and requirements.
- Responsible for ensuring vehicles and equipment are ready for use and advise staff in the use of vehicles and equipment as required to ensure the safe treatment of patients.
- Communicate with clinical and operational users to gain a full understanding of the nature of fault or problem with the vehicle and equipment. Assess the seriousness of the issues and implications and respond appropriately to the urgency of the requests.
- Ensure all works carried out are within a quality framework and meet manufacturers and regulatory requirements.
- Manage vehicle and equipment repair procedures, ensuring timely repair within the Trust and manufactures standard repair times and monitor service performance.
- Ensure a full accurate audit trail is recorded for vehicle and associated equipment ensuring the Dedicated Database is updated daily and all information input is correct and relevant at all times. Use analytical skills to frequently analyse data and ensure







maintenance and medical device information is modified and uploaded in an accurate, proficient and timely manner.

- To organise and prioritise daily work schedules, to work unsupervised and to professional standards in compliance with Department of Health guidelines and relevant standards set by statutory regulatory bodies, the relevant manufacturer and departmental procedures.
- To frequently organise and plan a complex range of activities based on the maintenance of vehicles and equipment; some of which will impact other departments or services across the Trust.
- To work autonomously and efficiently; prioritising and reprioritising workload around frequent daily interruptions.
- To act independently, promptly, and efficiently in response to emergency and unpredictable situations including working in areas and on other sites, as necessary, where the Trust provides a vehicle and equipment service regime.
- Ensuring high standards of dexterity, co-ordination and sensory skills are used on a daily basis while using precision tools on a daily basis to maintain delicate and expensive vehicles and equipment; maintaining frequent prolonged concentration during planned maintenance and fault finding on highly complex vehicle systems.
- Ensure high standards of autonomy; use specialist/expert knowledge to take action on interpretation of technical policies and procedures relating to vehicles and Equipment.
- Use expert knowledge in the high complexity of vehicle and equipment maintenance daily to exercise judgment and form a solution where there may be varying level of unique characteristics.
- Knowledge of the use and operation of quality management systems ISO 9001:2000 and ISO 13485:2012.
- As required receiving and commission all new vehicles and equipment purchased by the Trust before placing into active service as per the Trusts Procurement & Commissioning procedure. Carry out any Pre-Delivery Inspection checks (PDI) to new vehicles and equipment where required.
- Inform Team Leader in a timely manner as appropriate in cases of unplanned failures, events not previously experienced and unusual events.
- Responsible for maintaining adequate trust stock levels of spare vehicle and



equipment stock for the repair of vehicles and equipment, ensuring at all times the dedicated device database is updated at all times when stock is used

- Undertake all mandatory training necessary to become certified in the servicing and maintenance of vehicles and equipment used by the Trust, undertake any training to meet the requirements of this job role and other duties/additional training deemed necessary by the Trust to ensure the appropriate levels of service are maintained by the department.
- Undertake training both on an individual and group basis, through a variety of platforms that include face-to-face communication, reading and distance learning.
- To supervise and instruct, where required, apprentices, semi-skilled staff, and to attend any training courses
- There is a regular requirement on a daily basis to maintain and repair equipment that is potentially subject to contamination by hazardous substances and bodily fluids, and electrical equipment
- Ensure correct use of PPE is followed at all times.
- Providing clear, concise and factual information to support the vehicle and equipment processes which may include;
- Purchasing
- Maintenance
- Repair
- Service reports
- Coroner court reports
- Carry out all duties in accordance with the requirements of the Health and Safety at Work Act, relevant Statutory Regulations, Approved Codes of Conduct, Local Rules, Quality System Manuals and Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs).
- Contribute and adhere to Trusts health and safety policy and SOPs, ensure COSHH assessments, risk assessments and manual handling assessments are current and available to all staff.
- Ensure all health and safety incidents are accurately recorded and reported in a timely manner.
- Ensure own physical and mental well-being due to long periods of vehicle and equipment maintenance activity, some awkward working positions, frequent lifting of heavy equipment and bending/stooping on a daily basis.







- Actively implement safe systems of work, highlighting any risks and ensuring that safety and productivity is maximized.
- Practice appropriate workshop techniques so that the department is clean and tidy to ensure a safe working environment for all staff.
- Behave courteously and professional manner at all times with internal and external stakeholders (i.e. patients, training providers, service users) and seeks to ensure that the department provides the highest level of service.
- Responsible for reporting and equipment failures ensuring full and accurate information is provided at all times and copies of all reports made are filed for future use or reference.

• <u>Communication/information</u>

- To interrogate the dedicated vehicle and equipment database and to ensure accurate and timely fault diagnosis
- Provide advice, instruction and training to a variety of stakeholders who will have different levels of understanding.
- Liaise with Vehicle and equipment suppliers to obtain technical and commercial information in relation to equipment maintenance and evaluation, some which have high levels of complexity.
- Ensure all relevant legislation is adhered to due to the nature of the job (i.e. GDPR , Health and Safety at work).
- Ensure full confidentiality when downloading or obtaining patient records, clinical incidents and other sensitive data when required.
- The post holder will be required to communicate and provide technical information at all levels both internally and external.
- Communicating with and supervising external organizations that may carry out any
 vehicle and equipment maintenance regime on behalf of the Trust, providing the
 service agent with the relevant work flow to meet the Trusts strict service regime.
 Monitor service agent's performance against Trust standards and agreed service level
 agreements.
- Communicating with various vehicle and Equipment Manufacturers/Suppliers







regarding:

- Repair/Maintenance issues.
- Technical specifications.
- o Spare parts.
- o Loans/Trials of equipment.
- Evaluation of vehicle and equipment

Standard Role Requirements

Health and Safety

To maintain confidentiality in relation to personal data held for colleagues and patients, ensuring it is processed lawfully; for no purpose other than for which it was obtained; is relevant to that purpose; is retained for no longer than is necessary; is processed in accordance with the rights of the subject to access and accuracy; and is protected from accidental loss or damage in accordance with the requirements of the Data Protection Act 1998, and records management guidance.

To maintain confidentiality of patient-identifiable personal data using a non-identifiable alternative, where practicable, and limiting access on a strictly need to know basis in accordance with the responsibilities of the Trust's Caldicott Guardian.

Infection control
