We are offering the opportunity for a dietitian to join us in a development role from Band 5 to Band 6 Paediatric Dietitan.

As a Band 6 dietitian in this role, you will have progressed to independently manage a caseload of babies and children who are enterally fed in their own homes, this will include liaison with all relevant professions, including safeguarding meetings when required.

You will be working at Enhanced level providing specialised skills, knowledge and advice to health professionals and dietitians locally and within the region.

You will have skills knowledge and experience to cover for other dietetic team colleagues' sickness and annual leave.
