We are seeking an experienced Band 7 OT who is enthusiastic about working within eating disorders and mental health, can demonstrate sound clinical and leadership skills and would like the opportunity to develop services. We would require you to have the ability to work autonomously as well as part of a team, to have good workload management skills and a compassionate approach towards service users and staff.

The post is based in Mountbatten House in Dunstable, and will require close integrated working with the multi-disciplinary team to provide high quality OT provision. The post holder will be required to travel to see service users across Bedfordshire and Luton and also in the home environment.
